The Second Coming of Jesus

Recorded in the Book of **John, 14:2-3**, we first find our Lord is consoling his disciples, saying, *"In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you. ³And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come again, and receive you unto myself; that where I am, there ye may be also."*

With this being said by our Only Lord and Saviour, it seems that many believe it, but are not looking for his return. Simply, it is evident, because few are living a life that is conducive to reveal their claims.

What will be the nature or characteristics of his return? In **Matthew 24:44**, the Lord said to the Jews, previous to their destruction, *"...for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of man cometh."* This is also the nature of his second coming to the resurrection and Judgment. Then Paul wrote in **1 Thes-salonians 5:2**, that his return would be *"as a thief in the night,"* (unexpected).

Also, the Apostle Peter wrote in **2 Peter 3:3-4**, *"Knowing this first, that there shall come in the last days scoffers, walking after their own lusts, ⁴And saying, Where is the promise of his coming? for since the fathers fell asleep, all things continue as they were from the beginning of the creation."* Then in **Verse 10**, he agrees with Paul in saying that *"the day of the Lord will come as a thief in the night."* Then he adds *"the heavens shall pass away with a great noise" (big bang), "and the elements shall melt with fervent heat, the earth also and the works that are therein shall be burned up."*

Then, he imposes this statement, *"Seeing then that all these things shall be dissolved, what manner of persons ought ye to be in all holy conversation and godliness" (Verse 11).*

In **Revelation 3:3**, our Lord said to the church at Sardis, saying, *"Remember therefore how thou hast received and heard, and hold fast, and repent. If therefore thou shalt not watch, I will come on thee as a thief, and thou shalt not know what hour I will come upon thee."*

To those who claim to be believers, I ask this question, "Were you watching this past Lord's day at church time?" If not, "Would you consider yourself as a consistent watcher? Do you include your plans along the side of God's plans, or have you developed a plan of your own for servitude? Remember what our Lord is saying in **John 10:1**, *"Verily, verily, I say unto you, He that entereth not by the door into the sheepfold, but climbeth up some other way, the same is a thief and a robber."* Will thieves and robbers be saved without repentance?

In **Revelations 16:15**, our Lord says, *"Behold, I come as a thief. Blessed is he that watcheth, and keepeth his garments, lest he walk naked, and they see his shame."*

In closing, consider carefully the words in **He-brews 10:35-37**, *"Cast not away therefore your confidence, which hath great recompence of reward. ³⁶For ye have need of patience, that, after ye have done the will of God, ye might receive the promise. ³⁷For yet a little while, and he that shall come will come, and will not tarry"* (delay).

And so, the day will come, and only God knows, when Almighty God shall say to his Son and the reapers, *"Thrust in thy sickle, and reap: for the time is come for thee to reap; for the harvest of the earth is ripe. (Revelation 14:15).* Read Revelation 14:14-19. So, I believe that Jesus will come again, and even now, it may be sooner than we know. Are you a believer in the fact and in deed. I hope so. As the staff was removing his shirt, they noticed the name "Jesus" tattooed across his chest in large red letters. Quite amazed the ER nurse said to the attending physician, "From the way he looks and how he's dressed and his lack of cleanliness, I would assume that the name 'Jesus' on his chest is only skin deep."
