# Fiscal court announces plans to purchase BB&T Building

Judge/Executive Donnie Watson announced the possible purchase at Monday's special fiscal court meeting.

He said he has been in negotiations with good faith offer. BB&T for two months. The bank closed on April 12 of this year.
