

On Saturday, July 27, Chesapeake and Ohio steam locomotive 2716 will be on static display on Manchester Street, across from the Pepper Campus from 3 p.m. to 6 p.m., and the public is invited to get up close and personal with a piece of the past.

The locomotive is slated to be on display in Frankfort in front of the old Capital on Friday, July 26 from 6-8 p.m.; In Downtown Midway on July 27 from 10 a.m. until 1 p.m. and in Lexington July 27 from 3-6 p.m. The weekend will conclude on Sunday, July 28 as a welcoming ceremony is planned to be held at Veterna, starting at 3:30 p.m. The schedule is subject to change.
