- 10. Flowers must remain on display until Saturday, July 2. Exhibits must be picked up between 9:30 and 11 A.M.
- 11. No one but judges and their assistants will be allowed in the showroom while judging. The decision of the judges is final.
- 12. A rosette may be given to the specimen, potted plant and arrangement judged to be "Best of Show" at the discretion of the judges.
