BEAD WORK

*242. Junior Jewelry Beadwork – One piece of jewelry created by youth (jewelry quality only). No kits or pony beads allowed. Glass, clay or wooden beads (painted or carved) permitted only.

*243. Senior Jewelry Beadwork – One set (at least two items) of jewelry created by youth (jewelry quality only). No kits or pony beads allowed. No elastic material used to string beads. Glass, clay or wooden beads (painted or carved) permitted only. Examples: earring(s) and necklace; bracelet and necklace, etc.

244. Cloverbud Jewelry Beadwork- One piece of jewelry created by youth (jewelry quality only). No kits or pony beads allowed. Glass, clay or wooden beads (painted or carved) permitted only.

*276. Junior Leather Craft – item made from leather. May or may not be tooled. Kits allowed.
*277. Senior Leather Craft – item made from leather. May or may not be tooled. No kits allowed.
278. Cloverbud Leather Craft- item made from leather. May or may not be tooled. Kits allowed.

WEAVING CRAFTS

*279. Junior Weaving – One pair of place- mats, pot holders (pair) or one small wall hanging item that is made through various weaving techniques using mix media fibers, no plastic materials allowed. Baskets are not included. Wall hangings must be mounted and be ready for hanging.

*280. Senior Weaving – One item; rug, belt, stool with woven seat, or wall hanging item made through various weaving techniques using mixed media fibers, no plastic materials allowed. Wall hanging must be mounted and ready for hanging. Baskets are not included.

281. Cloverbud weaving- any item that has been created through using weaving as a technique. Any material allowed. Wall hangings must be mounted and be ready for hanging.

BASKET CRAFTS

*282. Basket Making – Natural materials, any size, shape or design. Non-natural materials may be woven into design.

SAND ART

- 283. Under 6" – Bottles/jars
- 284. Over 6" – Bottles/jars

NATURE CRAFTS

*286. Nature Crafts – Item made from natural materials only. No kits allowed. If wall hanging or wreath, item must include wire or hooks and be ready for hanging.

FOLK ART

*288. Folk Art – One item that has paint for a decorative or craft purpose other than canvas or paper. No Clothing! Examples include, but not limited to: weather vanes, old store signs and carved figures, itinerant portraits, carousel horses, fire buckets, painted game boards, cast iron doorstops and many other similar lines of highly collectible "whimsical" antiques.
