Rule: *Clear, clean STANDARD jars and two-piece lids must be used in all canning categories.*

Freezing/Drying:

*500. 12 pieces of Dried Fruit (banana or apple) in a container suitable for long term storage.

*501. Package of Colossal Cookies prepared for freezer

HONEY CLASSES

Rules:

1. Honey shows better in oval flat sided to square clear glass container except wide-mouth mason jars or wide-mouth honey jars may be used in class 541.

2. Fill jars to within ½ inch of top. Note: Two jars must be submitted.

*537. Two one pound containers of white extracted honey

*538. Two one pound containers of light amber extracted honey

*539. Two one pound containers of amber extracted honey

*540. Two one pound containers of dark amber extracted honey

*541. Two wide mouth quart jars of chunk honey, any color

Any class with an asterisk () on the left hand side is eligible to go on to the Kentucky State Fair.*

4-H FIELD CROPS & TOBACCO

Committee:

Each **Corn** class should include 8 ears shucked and labeled with variety and yield

*600. Yellow-ear (from previous year's crop)

*601. Yellow-ear (from current year's crop)

*602. Yellow-shelled (from previous year's crop, .5 gallon in a container)

*603. White-ear (from previous year's crop)

*604. White-ear (from current year's crop)

*605. White – shelled (from previous year's crop, .5 gallon in a container)

Popcorn: from the previous year's crop, 8 ears shucked, and labeled with variety and yield.

*606. White popcorn

*607. Red popcorn

*608. Yellow popcorn

Soybeans

*609. Soybeans - from the previous year's crop,

1-gallon ziplock bag, labeled to show variety and yield

*610. Soybeans – from the current year's crop, three stalks tied together below leaves, with roots intact, but free of soil and labeled to show variety.

Sorghum

*611. Sweet Sorghum - from the current year's crop, three stalks tied together below leaves, with roots intact, but free of soil.

*612. Grain Sorghum – from the current year's crop, three stalks tied together below leaves, with roots intact, but free of soil, and labeled to show variety.

*613. Grain Sorghum – from the previous year's crop, 1-gallon ziplock bag, and labeled to show variety and yield.

Legume and Grass Hay: ½ bale, from the current year's project crop, neatly tied and labeled.

Best block of:

*614. Alfalfa hay

*615. Red clover hay

*616. Other grass hay - Place hay in a double strength plastic bag.

*617. Timothy hay – Place hay in a double strength plastic bag.

*618. Mixed hay

Wheat and Barley: from the current year's crop, .5 gallon in a container, and labeled to show variety and yield.

*619. Wheat

*620. Barley

4-H TOBACCO

Specifications for exhibits:

Each exhibit of stripped Burley tobacco shall consist of two (2) hands, and each hand shall be made up of twenty (20) leaves or more.

*621. Stick of primed tobacco (20-30 bunches), 2 leaves per bunch, must be ground leaves

*622. Flyings

*623. Lug

*624. Leaf

*625. Tip

*626. Potted Burley Tobacco Plant (a 5 gallon plastic bucket is suggested.)

4-H DOG POSTER -- DIVISION A

Rules:

A. Educational posters MUST relate to dogs.

B. Posters should encourage the participant's imagination in developing a slogan/ theme that promotes a breed or project or educates the viewer about a dog project related activity. Examples of topics include but are not limited to: showing/grooming/caring for your dog, dog health, nutrition, and breed characteristics. Posters should be simple and focus on one message.

C. Participants may use a variety of media, however no 3-dimensional posters will be al-

lowed.

D. Posters must be no smaller than 20" x 30" and no larger than 24"x 30." Posters must be made using one of the following, matt board, or foam core board. No poster board is allowed.

E. Copyrighted characters such as Snoopy, Charlie Brown, or other cartoon characters cannot be used.

F. Posters will be judged on how well they present information and on their general appearance.
