Rules:

1. The committee may combine classes if there are less than two exhibitors exhibiting less than 3 animals.
2. All 4-H exhibitors must have completed the 6 hours of livestock education and show proof.
3. Any exhibitor wishing to change classes after registration must show registration.
4. Any bull over 1-year-old must have a nose ring.
5. All animals must be halter broken and under control of the exhibitor.
6. Any breed with 10 or more head with 2 exhibitors will be given their own breed class.
7. In order for cattle to enter a breed class, animals must have registration papers; otherwise, they will be considered commercial.

Premiums for Open Division:

1st Place \$15; 2nd Place \$12; 3rd Place \$10

Premiums for Youth Division:

\$180 maximum (4-H & FFA) - not to exceed ½ open class premiums if also eligible in open division.

Rules:

1. Animals to be shown in truck or trailer, separated into class groups. Same animal(s) not eligible in more than one class of youth division.
2. All 4-H exhibitors must have completed the 6 hours of livestock education and show proof.

Classes:

1. Sow and litter - pigs one (1) to six (6) weeks old. Sow must be owned by the exhibitor at least 30 days before farrowing. Judging on number of pigs, health, thriftiness and size for age of pigs.
2. Pen of 5 feeder pigs - five (5) to ten (10) weeks of age. The sow(s) must be owned by exhibitor at least 30 days before farrowing.
3. Pen with 1 market hog - weight 200-300 lbs. Must be owned by exhibitor a minimum of 60 days. Weight estimated by exhibitor and concurred by judge and show official(s).
4. Pen of 2 market hogs - weight 200-300 lbs. Must be owned by exhibitor a minimum of 60 days. Weight estimated by exhibitor and concurred by judge and show official(s).
