

Engineers fall to Mason & Lee Co.

The Estill County Engineers are 8-6 overall and 2-1 in district after falling to Mason County 78-58 in the Kentucky 2A Sectionals and losing to the Lee County Bobcats for the first time since January 2013.

Estill had defeated Powell County 68-51 and Greenup County 64-55 to advance in the 2A Championships but could not overcome 10th Region

perennial power Mason County Royals.

Lee County last defeated Estill in January 2013 in triple overtime 78-75 but came from behind on Friday night to beat the Engineers 60-58 in the final seconds.

Estill played away at Madison Southern on Tuesday night but return home on Friday for a girls-boys double-header against Powell County.

Lady Engineers are 7-9 and 1-2

The Estill County Lady Engineers are now 7-9 overall and 1-2 in the 56th District after an up-and-down season.

The Lady Engineers dropped district games to Owsley County's Lady Owls 72-56 and fell 61-58 to the Powell County Lady Pirates in the first game of the Kentucky 2A Sectionals Championship.

Friday night, in a boys-girls double-header at Beattyville, the Estill La-

dies picked up a huge win 59-21 over the Lee County Lady Kats.

Junior Angel Haley led Estill with 20 points against Lee and sophomore Jayce Long added 14. Another junior Sara Baker put in 12.
