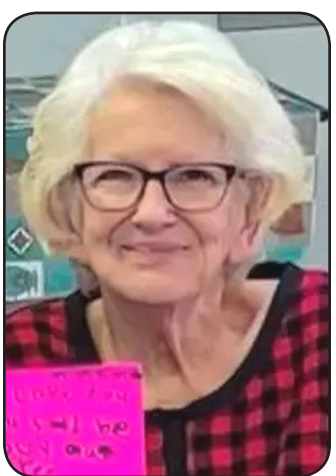

So, I agreed to accompany my best friend to the hardware store to get a new one. I went alone, knowing how embarrassing such a purchase could be for 10-year-old girls.

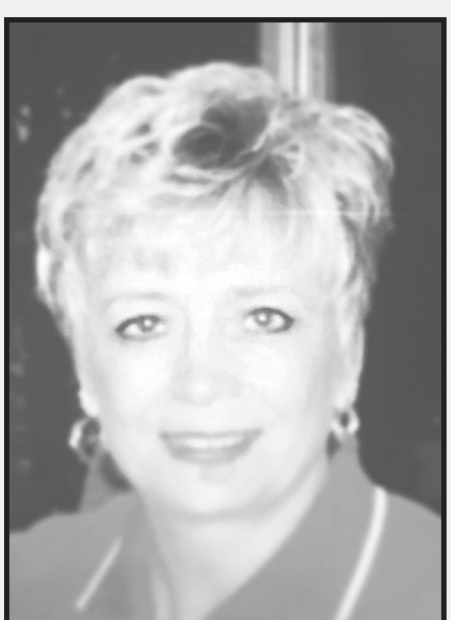
What if Nancy, the lady of the store, was not there, and we had to ask Jim, her husband for such unmentionables?

Too often we take our modern conveniences for granted. We think nothing of having two and three bathrooms in our home.

But back in 1940's and until the early 70's people still had outhouses not far from their houses. I know we didn't have an inside bath-
